8 **Grant Application – Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) Program**

9
10 **WHEREAS**, Washington County Code Section 4.27 requires that all county grant appli-
11 cations be approved by the County Board of Supervisors; and

12
13 **WHEREAS**, the TAD program is intended to reduce recidivism, increase public safety
14 and reduce the jail population; and

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16 **WHEREAS**, since the start of the TAD program in 2007, 240 clients have been served
17 specifically for 2nd OWI cases and referrals for DOC clients in need of services; and

18
19 **WHEREAS**, of the 240 clients to date, 14% are active in the program, 58% have suc-
20 cessfully completed the program and 28% were terminated from the program for non com-
21 pliance; and

22
23 **WHEREAS**, Genesis Behavioral Services, Inc (treatment provider for the program) re-
24 ports the overall completion rate of the program is 68%, with 82% of OWI clients completing the
25 program; and

27 **WHEREAS**, Washington County is one of the seven counties eligible for this grant, and
28 statistics indicate that the subjects that successfully completed the 2007 and 2008 program had
29 less then 10% return to court for 3rd OWI, indicating the program has provided positive results
30 for the community; and

32 **WHEREAS**, Washington County has been advised that it will be offered the grant fund-
33 ing for the 2010 and 2011 calendar years with a 5% decrease in the original funding or \$123,513
34 for the programs with continued contractual services of Genesis Behavioral to serve OWI refer-
35 rals from the District Attorney’s office and probation clients from the DOC office in West Bend,
36 with Washington County residency; and

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38 **WHEREAS**, the grant funding for the TAD Program does not require any local match
39 funds;

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41 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Washington County Board of Super-
42 visors that the Washington County Sheriff’s Department is authorized to apply for the grant
43 funding described herein for the continuation of the TAD program in Washington County.

1 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Sheriff's Department is hereby authorized to
2 accept the above noted grant funds to continue the Treatment Alternatives and Diversion pro-
3 gramming.

5 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that upon receipt of grant funds, the use of same will
6 be within the parameters set forth in the grant program.

8 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Board Chairman and County Clerk are
9 authorized to execute the necessary application or other documents in order to grant funding de-
10 scribed herein, subject to review and approval of the County Attorney's Office.
