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8 **Grant Application – Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) Program**

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10 **WHEREAS**, Washington County Code Section 4.27 requires that all county grant appli-  
11 cations be approved by the County Board of Supervisors; and

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13 **WHEREAS**, the Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) program is intended to re-  
14 duce recidivism, increase public safety and reduce the jail population; and

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16 **WHEREAS**, since the start of the TAD program in 2007, 340 clients have been served  
17 specifically for 2<sup>nd</sup> OWI cases and referrals for DOC clients in need of services; and

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19 **WHEREAS**, of the 340 clients to date, 36 are currently active in the program, 217 have  
20 successfully completed the program and 87 were terminated from the program for non com-  
21 pliance; and

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23 **WHEREAS**, Genesis Behavioral Services, Inc (treatment provider for the program) re-  
24 ports the overall completion rate of the program is 72%, with 82% of OWI clients completing the  
25 program; and

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27 **WHEREAS**, Washington County has been advised they will be offered grant funding of  
28 \$123,513 for the 2011 calendar year for the program with continued contractual services of Ge-  
29 nesis Behavioral to serve OWI referrals from the District Attorney’s office and probation clients  
30 from the DOC office in West Bend, with Washington County residency; and

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32 **WHEREAS**, Washington County is one of the seven counties eligible for this grant, and  
33 statistics indicate that the subjects that successfully completed the 2007 and 2008 program had  
34 20 % return to court for 3rd OWI, indicating the program has provided positive results for the  
35 community;

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37 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Washington County Board of Super-  
38 visors that the Washington County Sheriff’s Department application for the grant funding de-  
39 scribed herein is ratified and the continuation of the TAD program for Washington County is en-  
40 dorsed.

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42 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Sheriff’s Department is hereby authorized to  
43 accept the above noted grant funds to continue the Treatment Alternatives programming.

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45 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that upon receipt of grant funds, the use of same will  
46 be within the parameters set forth in the grant program.

1           **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Board Chairman and County Clerk are  
2 authorized to execute the necessary application or other documents in order to grant funding de-  
3 scribed herein, subject to review and approval of the County Attorney’s Office.
