8 **Grant Application – Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) Program**

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10 **WHEREAS**, Washington County Code Section 4.27 requires that all county grant
11 applications be approved by the County Board of Supervisors; and

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13 **WHEREAS**, the TAD program is intended to reduce recidivism, increase public safety
14 and reduce the jail population; and

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16 **WHEREAS**, the Public Safety Committee has monitored the program and supports its
17 continuation; and

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19 **WHEREAS**, since the start of the TAD program in 2007, 482 clients have been served
20 specifically for 2nd OWI cases and referrals for Wisconsin Department of Corrections (DOC)
21 clients in need of services; and

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23 **WHEREAS**, of the 482 clients to date, 22 are currently active in the program, 333 have
24 successfully completed the program and 127 were terminated from the program for non-
25 compliance; and

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27 **WHEREAS**, Genesis Behavioral Services, Inc. (treatment provider for the program)
28 reports the overall completion rate of the program is 72.4%; and

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30 **WHEREAS**, Washington County was originally advised the grant offered would be
31 \$83,371 with a \$27,790 match, which was budgeted for in the 2013 Sheriff’s operating budget;
32 and

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34 **WHEREAS**, Washington County has been advised they will be offered a revised grant
35 funding of \$92,635 with a \$30,878 match requirement for the 2013 calendar year for the program
36 with continued contractual services of Genesis Behavioral to serve OWI referrals from the
37 District Attorney’s office and probation clients from the DOC office in West Bend, with
38 Washington County residency; and

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40 **WHEREAS**, \$27,790 was budgeted in 2013 for the match and \$3,088 from the
41 Electronic Monitoring expense account will be applied to the match to cover the total match
42 required of \$30,878; and

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44 **WHEREAS**, the Public Safety Committee approved this resolution with the higher
45 amounts; and

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47 **WHEREAS**, Washington County is one of the seven counties eligible for this grant, and
48 statistics indicate that the subjects that successfully completed the 2007 thru 2010 program had a

1 new conviction rate of 27%, indicating the program has provided positive results for the
2 community;

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4 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Washington County Board of
5 Supervisors that the Washington County Sheriff's Department application for the grant funding
6 described herein is ratified and the continuation of the TAD program for Washington County is
7 endorsed.

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9 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Sheriff's Department is hereby authorized to
10 accept the above noted grant funds with the County match as described herein to continue the
11 Treatment Alternatives programming.

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13 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that upon receipt of grant funds, the use of same will
14 be within the parameters set forth in the grant program.

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16 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Board Chairman and County Clerk are
17 authorized to execute the necessary application or other documents in order to grant funding
18 described herein, subject to review and approval of the County Attorney's Office.
