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15 **SECTION 1.** Section 7.02 of the Code is amended to read:
16 **7.02 WASHINGTON COUNTY STAFFING PLAN.** (AM 13-22)

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26 E* Positions are exempt under FLSA, but due to department operations, overtime at time and
27 one-half will be paid as indicated in Chapter 7 of the Washington County Code, as

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30 **SECTION 2.** The list of pay grades established in Section 7.03(1)(a) shall be adjusted to
31 incorporate the changes proposed in this ordinance.

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33 **SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This ordinance shall become effective upon
34 passage by the Board of Supervisors and publication as provided by law.
