Note: It is not a requirement that animal to animal bites be reported by the Health Department to law enforcement authorities. If the owner wishes to have assistance with contacting the owner of a pet that bit their pet, they can contact their local law enforcement agency for assistance. If the owner wishes to have assistance with capturing a wild animal that bit an owned animal, they can contact the Washington County Humane Society at 262-677-4388 or their local law enforcement agency for assistance.

Disposition of the animals:

State statute 95.21 requires quarantine (60 or 180 days) of pets/livestock that have been exposed to rabies. See ss 95.21 for more information. Owner of pet/livestock should contact their veterinarian for follow-up with quarantine.

Advice to animal owners:

- Wash wound well with soap and warm water
- Capture or contain the animals if you can do so without further injury to yourself. You may need to depend on the animal's owner, law enforcement and/or the Humane Society to capture animals.
- See a veterinarian to address post bite treatment for your pet
