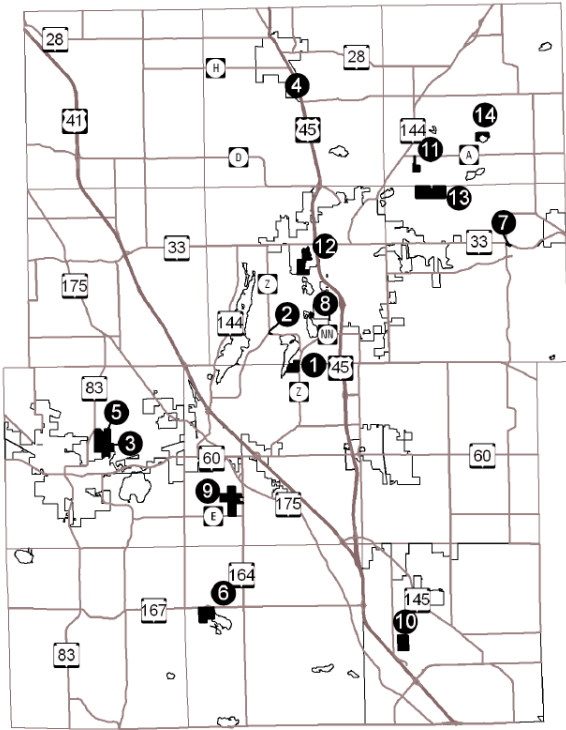

In non-aid cases, the Child Support Agency will provide assistance to custodial parents upon application. The Agency may obtain an order for child support and medical support, or enforce an existing order.

When a child is born to parents who are not married, the Agency will commence an action to establish paternity. Child support orders, repayment of birth and other expenses may be ordered.

The Child Support Agency reviews support orders for modification and pursues collection of child support arrearages through actions which include court orders, income withholding, liens, money judgments, and intercept of State and Federal income tax refunds and lottery winnings.

The County Treasurer is a Constitutional Officer elected every four years by the voters of Washington County.

The Treasurer’s office provides the Tax Billing Service to Washington County municipalities, is the tax collection department, and the bank for the county.

With the tax billing service, it is our responsibility to generate and print the tax bills and tax rolls for 19 of the 20 municipalities in Washington County. We work with the Wisconsin Department of Revenue to incorporate the latest legislation passed that may affect the tax bill.

The County Treasurer serves as the administrator of the Lottery and Gaming Credit Claim Program for Washington County. As tax collector, the Treasurer is responsible for the collection of the delinquent and postponed real estate taxes from the twenty municipalities in the county. Unpaid real estate taxes constitute a lien against that property, therefore, the maintenance of accurate records of payment is a vital function of the Treasurer’s office. Tax rolls are open to the public and are consulted daily by representatives of real estate and title insurance companies and financial institutions. Homebuyers also request information from our office. We maintain a central file of all tax rolls for Washington County going back to the 1840s that are accessible almost anytime and researched by historians and genealogists.

As the county’s banker, the Treasurer receipts all revenues received by the county and its various departments and deposits the money at the bank. The County Treasurer functions as cash manager for the county. The Treasurer invests cash balances on a daily basis. The Treasurer schedules investments to meet the payrolls, bills, and Debt Payment dates.

The County Treasurer is a resource for the local municipal clerks and treasurers.

The payroll function provides timely and accurate payroll processing, fringe benefit payments and all reports as required by law. The department works with the Administrative Coordinator to prepare the annual budget.

Information Systems provides programming, technical support and telecommunications to county departments. Programming staff write and maintain programs on the county's computer system. The technical support staff installs and maintains computer and telephone equipment, provides training and maintains a help desk for county departments.

A state team determined that all responsibilities and requirements of Wisconsin Statutes Chapters 250 through 255 and Administrative Rules HFS 140 were satisfactorily met. Level designation is reviewed at least every 5 years and is used in part to determine formulas for state grant fund allocations. There are three levels of health departments per state law.

- Health Promotion
- Disease and Injury Prevention

The Human Services Department is responsible for all human and social service needs of the County according to provisions of Wisconsin State Statutes 46.23. The primary function of Human Services is to create a comprehensive planning approach to address the community human service needs under the governance of the Human Service Board.

The Human Services Department (HSD) provides county wide services for persons with alcohol and other drug abuse problems, developmental disabilities and/or severe persistent mental illness. HSD is also the focal point for services to children and families, child abuse and neglect, juvenile justice and multiple economic assistance

programs.

The Washington County Mental Health Center, a branch of the Behavioral Health Division, includes Lifespan Clinical Services. This program offers evaluation, counseling and treatment to children and adults through a multidisciplinary professional staff. The Community Treatment Services program delivers intensive services to persons with persistent mental health issues so they can successfully live independently within the community.

The Access and Outreach Division includes a 24/7 program that combines the functions of child intake and assessment with the acute care mental health crisis program. Access and Outreach will be available to work with individuals and families experiencing an emergency or who have concerns about the functioning of individuals in the community.

The Children and Families Division is responsible for administering programs related to the protection of children and safety of the community. This division has the statutory responsibility for investigating and providing services in situations where it is believed children have been harmed or neglected. Children and Families also assess and supervise juveniles who have been involved in delinquent activities and status offenses such as school truancy, runaway or uncontrolled behavior.

HSD is the locale for providing various economic support programs. We assess individuals and families and determine economic eligibility for such services as child care, food share, Medical Assistance including Badger Care and Energy Assistance.

The office is responsible for the investigation of deaths in Washington County and determining the cause and manner of death in the following categories: all deaths occurring where there are unusual or suspicious circumstances; all homicides; all suicides; all accidental deaths, whether or not the accident caused the death; all motor vehicle deaths; all deaths by abortion; all deaths where poison is involved, whether or not the poison caused the death; all cremations; all deaths where there is no doctor in attendance; all deaths where the physician refuses to sign a death certificate; and all sudden unexpected infant death cases.

In 1874, original Washington County pioneer, Maxon Hirsh, held a festive dinner at West Bend's Washington House. Early area pioneers were the special guests at this event, and everyone heartily enjoyed themselves.

The success of this special evening encouraged attendees to organize the "Old Settler's Club." That same year, a preliminary meeting was held, a constitution drafted, and officers elected. The first meeting and celebration of the "Old Settler's Club" was held at the Washington House on February 22, 1875 – President George Washington's birthday.

The club continued throughout the years, changing the name to the "Washington County Old Settler's Club and Historical Society" in 1941, and finally to the "Washington County Historical Society" in 1954.

As the organization evolved over time, many community members contributed stories, artifacts, photos, and papers documenting the area's rich history. Today the Washington County Historical Society is a professional organization that operates four distinct historic museums.

The Old Courthouse Museum is an excellent example of Romanesque Revival architecture and houses the natural history of Washington County. The Old Sheriff's Residence and Jail is a barrier free site and one of the few remaining sheriff's residence and jail buildings in the United States. The St. Agnes Historic Site and School Complex is an excellent example of 1850's architecture and the first public school in the area. The West Bend Co./Regal Ware Museum is the venue for the most comprehensive historic housewares collections in the United States. This museum also tells the story of women's history and American Consumerism.

The Washington County Historical Society is committed to serving the community. Museum admissions, events, programs, educational resources and research assistance remain free or minimal cost. A HISTORY OF WASHINGTON COUNTY

Washington County is within the southeastern quarter of the state, the most populous and urban section of Wisconsin. It contains 432 square miles, 12 townships, (Addison, Barton, Erin, Farmington, Germantown, Hartford, Jackson, Kewaskum, Polk, Trenton, Wayne and West Bend), six villages (Germantown, Jackson, Kewaskum, Newburg, Richfield and Slinger), and two Cities (Hartford and West Bend), plus "urban sprawl" from Milwaukee.

The first white men to reach the area were Marquette and Joliet, who stopped at the mouth of Sauk Creek in 1673 and may have planted a cross on top of Holy Hill. LaSalle and Hennepin were at Sauk Creek in 1679. Around 1700, a Jesuit missionary, Joseph J. Marest, spent the winter there, probably, the first white man to live here. In 1818 S.A. Storrow, Judge Advocate of the United States Army, passed through as he returned from Green Bay to Ft. Dearborn (Chicago).

Settlement began in the 1830s, when British-Americans, mainly from New York, Connecticut and Pennsylvania, came north along the Milwaukee River and what later became the Green Bay Road. They found friendly Indians thinly scattered, because they needed the wildlife of the forests for food and clothing. Winnebagoes (of the Sioux nation) claimed the Rock River Valley before the memory of the Algonquins, including Potowatomies, Sacs (Sauks and Ozaukis), and Menominees, who had villages and camps at the sites of Grafton, Cedarburg, Thiensville, Newburg, Waubeka, Saukville, Port Washington, West Bend, Kewaskum, Pike Lake, Little Cedar Lake, and Monches. The earliest people in Washington County were Mound Builders. Evidence of their presence are the effigy mounds found north of West Bend on CTH A. Following the Mound Builders, the Menominees and Potowatomie Nations settled throughout Washington County, primarily around Pike Lake. In 1838, the Menominees, who held sway over the county, were removed by United States treaty to land west of the Mississippi River; but many returned. In 1859, Kewaskum was Chief of the Potowatomies and an honored friend of Desmore Maxon of the First Wisconsin Legislature. Waubeka was Chief over about 100 Sauks, and Chief Monches ruled the Menominees here and southward in Waukesha County.

The first permanent settlements in what is now Washington County were at Germantown, where Anton G. Wiesner and Levi Ostrander came in 1839. By 1845, all of that township had been taken. Michael Lynch was first to settle in Erin in 1841; and all of that had been bought by 1846. Samuel Spivey purchased a tract in Richfield in 1841; but Jacob Snyder, also in 1841, was first to live there. The village was started by Philipp Laubenheimer in 1842. A Canadian named Jehiel Case was a squatter at Hartford, without government title, before Timothy Hall came in 1843. The area was called Wayne, Benton, and Wright before being named Hartford. James and George Rossman and Nic Simon started the city in 1844. In 1843, Alfred Ohrendorf was the only settler in Addison, John McDonald and Peter Devereau were in Jackson, and James Williamson was in Polk; but Densmore Maxon, a surveyor, lived next to Chief Kewaskum in Cedar Creek in 1844.

William P. Barnes was one of the first settlers of the Town of Kewaskum (first called North Bend) in 1844. He went on to become the Assessor. J.H. Myers started the village in 1852. Farmington was first called Clarence by the founders, Amasa Curtis and Elijah Westover, in 1845. That same year B. Schleisingerweil started a store at Schleisingerville, which kept that name until the railroad came in 1855, bringing merchants Lehman Rosenheimer and John Pick, and shortening the name to Slinger in 1921. Although Bela Wilcox bought the first 80 acres in the Town of Barton, its first pioneer was Barton Salisbury, who came in 1845 to what was then Newark. Barton Salisbury established the village of Salisbury Mills and was so influential that in 1853 both the township and village were named Barton. In 1848, Barton Salisbury fell to his death while helping build the Webster House in Newburg.

The first land entry in West Bend was made in 1839 by Martin Otis Walker; but in 1845, when the Legislature authorized a new road from Milwaukee to Fond du Lac, Commissioners Byron Kilbourn (the other founder of Milwaukee), James Kneeland, and E.B. Wolcott found only a squatter named E.N. Higgins living in a shack at the bend in the river. The four men shared the village site of 720 acres, for which \$900.00 was paid. Kilbourn suggested the name of **West Bend**; and later that year Isaac Verbeck named the stream which went through the present Badger Middle School grounds **Battle Creek**. By 1848, the village had about 30 families, none of them on the east side of the river. In 1853, Kilbourn, Wightman, Kneeland, Wolcott, and their wives legally gave the square of ground where the present Old Jail and Courthouse Annex are located to the county as a park to be used for public purposes forever; and in 1856, the first County Fair was held there. Fillmore was begun by Christian Beger, and Wayne by Alexander W. Stow and Konrad Schleicher in 1846. Jackson was begun by Franz Reis in 1848. Mayfield got its name from the Swiss founder, Andreas Reiderer in 1851 but was later known as Katzbach for Joseph Katz. At Young America, the mill built in 1851 by Morris Wait burned to the ground, was rebuilt, but burned again in 1857. Until then it was sending extra fine flour to Milwaukee, and the first iron bridge north of Milwaukee was in use there. The only resident of Boltonville in 1854 was Harlow Bolton, and Allenton did not come into existence until Wisconsin Central Railway came through in the 1880s and opened Dekorra Station there.
