RESIDENTIAL HOUSING UNITS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY GOVERNMENTS

The following table provides the historical number of housing units for each of the municipalities within Washington County based on data collected by the U.S. Census Bureau. Each municipality has been ranked based on the percent change from the 1990 to 2000 Census. For example, the Village of Jackson experienced an increase of 1,030 housing units from 1990 to 2000. Based on the 1990 figures of 981 housing units, the increase represents a 105.0 percent increase in housing units from 1990 to 2000. Because the 105.0 percent increase had been the highest increase for all municipalities within Washington County, the Village of Jackson received a rank of "1". Of interest, both the Village of Jackson and Village of Slinger experienced the greatest population increase as well as the greatest increase in housing units for the 1990 to 2000 period, ranking 1 and 2 respectively. The data presented here does not take into consideration any annexations and ensuing boundary adjustments that may have occurred to the municipalities.
