- 8 Ms. Jaszewski reported on the Finance Committee's recommendation to provide \$100,000 to \$150,000 in
- 9 funds for paying the deductibles on the property claims. The county clerk's 2010 budget includes \$57,734
- of levy for this fund, which will be transferred to the general fund and designated for Insurance
- Deductible payments of property claims. In addition, early next year a resolution will be presented to the
- Administrative Services and Finance committees with a proposal to transfer \$42,2266 to \$92,266 from
- the undesignated portion of the general fund, to the designated insurance deductible account to obtain the
- \$100,000 to \$150,000 desired amount in that fund. Each year, a portion of the County Clerk's budget
- would include levy to be transferred into the designated insurance deductible portion of the General Fund to replace funds that have been used.
