

**WASHINGTON COUNTY LANDMARKS COMMISSION
MINUTES – MEETING 137 - June 2, 2008
WASHINGTON COUNTY COURTHOUSE**

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Marilyn Merten at 2 p.m. The meeting was properly noticed and posted.

SAVVY SENIORS PUBLICATIONS: A free newspaper, Savvy Seniors, is published four times a year by the Kewaskum Statesman. The editor will contact Ms. Wenzlaff when they are ready to assemble the next issue, and their reporting staff will interview representatives from one of the following landmarks: the Dheinsville Historic District, the Washington County Courthouse Square, the Home of Reuben John Schmahl, and the Moritz Farmhouse.

WASHINGTON COUNTY FAIR BOOTH: County Fair dates are July 22-27, 2008. Landmark Commission members preferred that the booth remain in the Pavillion. The booth will be set up by Mr. Dettmann, Ms. Shaver, and Ms. Wenzlaff, and commission members volunteered to be present at the booth during fair business hours.

2009 LANDMARKS BUDGET: Ms. Merten and County Clerk Jaszewski discussed expenses pending in the 2008 budget, which include printing and collating the driving tours and coloring books; the cost to manufacture the Schubert Cheese Factory landmark plaque; and the cost of a post when a participant requests mounting the plaque on a post, rather than attaching it to a building. Ms. Jaszewski will determine the 2009 request once the current year expenses are complete.

APPLICATIONS: An inquiry was made regarding application for a landmark designation for the Messer/Mayer Mill in the Village of Richfield. County Clerk Jaszewski will forward a letter and landmarks application.

COLORING BOOK: Ms. Schroeder is making last minute corrections, and the updated coloring project is ready for printing in Central Reproductions.

DRIVING TOUR BROCHURES: Central Reproductions is finishing the printing and collating of the updated driving tours for distribution at the County Fair.
