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14 **LIVERY SERVICE BID – MEDICAL EXAMINER**

15 *Appearance: Kelly McAndrews, Medical Examiner*

16 Ms. McAndrews presented the bid awards for the Livery Transportation Service. A joint award of three
17 options is being made to all three firms. This is being done to provide a "safety net" to both the primary
18 service provider and the Washington County Medical Examiner's office. In the event the primary bidder
19 (Patton Transfer) is not able to respond to a call, cannot respond within a specified time period according
20 to scene needs, or cannot provide the requested number of personnel and vehicles, the secondary and
21 tertiary services will be called in similar fashion. Ms. McAndrews stated this is a one year contract with
22 option to renew and Washington County reserves the right to call out of order.

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42 **STATE COURTS BUDGET REQUEST FOR 2007-9 BIENIMIUM**

43 *Appearance: Clerk of Courts Kristine Deiss*

44 Ms. Deiss discussed the proposed State Courts budget submission to the Governor and Legislature. The
45 focus of the State Courts budget is partnerships with counties and other justice stakeholders. The State
46 is proposing to eliminate the current circuit court support for the Guardian Ad Lidem payment programs
47 and in its place, a new circuit court services support payment program would be created, which would
48 increase Washington County's revenues by approximately \$150-200,000 if passed. An auditor position
49 and statutory changes are being requested to institute a standardize program for the recording, reporting
50 and auditing of annual county circuit court costs and revenues in order to obtain accurate revenue and
51 expenditure data on county costs to operate the courts. The State is seeking funding for all cases

1 requiring certified interpreters and is instituting a safety training program. Additional revenues are being
2 requested to allow the CCAP program to implement an electronic filing system for all circuit court case
3 types in all counties.

5 **JAIL POPULATION REPORT**

6 Sheriff Rahn stated today there are 214 adults, 27 are females. Twenty-one are on electronic monitoring
7 and of these, 9 are female. Today there are 8 juveniles, 2 from Ozaukee, 1 from Jefferson, 1 from Dodge
8 and 4 from Washington County. For the month of October, the average daily adult inmate population was
9 214, in-house 192, with 22 on electronic monitoring. Female daily average was 22, and the average daily
10 juvenile population was 13. Out-of-county juvenile billable days for October were 164, for a total of \$
11 18,860 revenue from Ozaukee, Dodge and Jefferson counties. There were 58 juvenile court intakes and 15
12 juvenile custody intakes. Sheriff Rahn distributed a monthly major incident report.
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14 **SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT STAFFING REPORT**

15 The Civil Service Commission is meeting on November 14 & 15 for civil service interviews. The
16 Sheriff's Department has three new deputies, more backgrounds were sent to the detective bureau to
17 conduct background checks, and there will be additional interviews to hire two more deputies.

19 **FATALITY REPORT**

20 There have been 8 fatalities in Washington County for 2006. This time in 2005, there were 14.

22 **TAD GRANT UPDATE**

23 Sheriff Rahn reported Genesis is working on the overall layout of program and setting up their case
24 managers for oversight of the program. The program is expected to start on January 1, 2007.
