OVERVIEW OF THE CURRENT WASHINGTON COUNTY RADIO SYSTEM

Lt. Michael Hetzel provided a handout and presented an overview of the current radio communications system in the county, which is 18 years old. He reviewed current system development, components, tower sites, mobile and portable equipment and other radio systems throughout Washington County. The current equipment is no longer manufactured and repairs would be very costly or not able to be made, and we do not have the coverage that we should have. Mr. Miller stated that feedback he received from police and fire departments was that everyone is interested in a new system.

AREAS OF CONSIDERATION FOR NEW RADIO SYSTEM (DRAFT)

Sheriff Rahn discussed the "DRAFT," prepared by Mr. Kohl, Mr. Miller, Mr. Johnson and himself, that was distributed to committee members regarding areas of consideration for the new radio system. The DRAFT includes determining the need for the system, what type of system, base station, back-up base station, mobile radios in vehicles, portable capabilities, central dispatch versus 4 PSAP's, tie-in with wireless 9-1-1, consider Ozaukee County as back-up, costs of equipment, antenna needs and location, cost of consulting, timeline, grant availability, Advisory Committee makeup and appointments as necessary.

Several questions were raised by committee members. Mr. Berchem asked if municipalities are aware of the proposed radio system for the county. Mr. Miller responded that all municipalities, emergency management, parks, DPW, town and village administrators were sent letters asking for feedback. Mr. Johnson stated that there would be presentations to the public regarding the radio system. Mr. Tennies brought up whether or not the plan is to separate dispatch from the Sheriff's Department as in Waukesha County. Mr. Miller stated that the committee needs to look at the entire operation. Sheriff Rahn stated that the focus should be on a new radio system and not on consolidated dispatch. Mr. Berchem brought up the update of the wireless 9-1-1 system. Lt. Hetzel stated that the wireless 9-1-1 system affects the telephones and has nothing to do with radio equipment.
