EVIDENCE/STORAGE BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE

- Appearance: County Engineer/Surveyor Scott Schmidt
- The contract with Cardinal Construction for the construction of the building is now signed and Mr. Schmidt stated the building has been ordered. The seeding of the grounds is now complete. Change order #7 was presented, which is to delay the completion date from November 1, 2012 to December 21, 2012 due to the delay in signing the contract with Cardinal Construction. Mr. Schmidt presented change order #6, which is to use W6x9 galvanized I beam DOT post for the guard rail system in lieu of the 6" pipe, which will result in a cost savings of \$2,300. The total cost of the project to date is \$794,559, excluding the credit for the change order above that has not yet been approved by the Chairperson and Sheriff.

DISCUSSION ON TOWING SERVICES

Captain Gonwa reported on the procedures for dispatching towing services and how the calls are distributed to the various services within the County. The Sheriff's Department does not specifically endorse, or prohibit, the use of any individual towing service or operator for use by the department. The first priority is to use the towing service the owner or operator of the vehicle requests if they are available and if the towing service is able to provide the service. A report of the various towing services and distribution of calls was provided through a PowerPoint presentation. Sheriff Schmidt stated he has informed the dispatch operators to utilize a wide number of towing operators and feels the current system of dispatching for this service is adequately working.

1 Unclaimed/Indigent Contract Update

Mr. Posont reported he is working on the specifications for dividing the contract between the cremation and 2 disposition of unclaimed/indigent decedents when finished, it will be let for bid through Purchasing. The bid 3 specifications will provide for a one year contract, but will include the opportunity for an alternate bid with a 4 three year contract. 5

Mutual Aid Agreement & Multi-Agency Training Agreement

- Mr. Posont has contacted Dodge and Fond du Lac counties regarding a potential mutual aid agreement to 8
- share costs and resources relating to the Medical Examiner's office. The goal is to get such an agreement in 9
- place, which would also include training, which is similar to the mutual aid agreements in place for 10
- emergency services. The Committee supports the effort of Mr. Posont to pursue mutual aid agreements with 11

surrounding counties. 12

RECORDS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (RMS) PROJECT UPDATE

15 Captain Gonwa reported that staff has confirmed addresses of all multi-units in Washington County and this data is now in the system. Mr. Gonwa is negotiating with Pro Phoenix because they began the one year free 16 service when the system was installed and he feels it should begin when we actually begin using the system. 17

- The initial "go live" date was November 1, 2012, and Mr. Gonwa stated it will probably be February 1, 18
- 19 2013. Although the static entry elements are approximately 90% complete, over 200 individuals will require training and this will take time, which makes February a realistic "go live" date. 20

DISCUSSION ON PAY PLAN EFFECTS ON SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Sheriff Schmidt distributed a Sheriff's staff pay plan comparison between the current plan and the proposed pay plan for top level staff. He would like to inform this Committee about how the plan would impact the Sheriff's Department. Corrections and Communications will have the largest number of people negatively affected by the new pay plan. Sheriff Schmidt expressed concern regarding the possibility of individuals having their wages reduced instead of frozen and he addressed some incorrect comments that were made by Supervisors at the last County Board meeting during the pay plan presentation by Charlie Carlson. Sheriff Schmidt compared duties of County jail staff and State Corrections staff and discussed the impact that wage reductions would have on the department.
