<u>Collections</u> – Mr. Werner reviewed the collection struggles occurring with a Medicare HMO plan.

The committee instructed Mr. Somers to verify that the Oxygen Vendors utilized by the Care Management Organizations are appropriately insured.

<u>Structural Engineer discussion</u> – The committee instructed Mr. Somers to have the cracked north stairwell column weather sealed, as well as the cracked brick face on the north end of the building. Further they instructed Mr. Somers to monitor the crack by periodically measuring its' size.

## Reports from Administrator

Roof Update – We are working with Firestone toward resolution.

Therapy Services Contract – Greenfield Therapy has been chosen as therapy provider for the campus. Their rates are 8.4% less than our current vendor and they have agreed to keep their rates the same for three years.

Psychiatric Services Contract – Behavioral Solutions Inc. has been selected to provide psychiatric consultant services to the campus. This is a large group that will be able to provide the level of service needed for our population. We should also save in the range of \$1,800/year compared to our current arrangement.

Hair Salon Services Contract – Classic Hair Care terminated their contract with Samaritan effective 10/15/11. The stylists that were serving our campus formed their own company and are providing the services to our residents under the same terms as was with Classic Hair Care.	
$3^{rd}$ Quarter status update – Mr. Somers reviewed the operational status of Samaritan, the Fields and the Senior Dining program through the $3^{rd}$ quarter of 2011.
